


Health Care Aide Certificate - 1 year

Become an integral part of the health-care team as a Health Care Aide. In this rewarding field, you will work in acute care facilities, continuing care facilities, hospitals, as well as

in client's homes, providing high level front-line care to clients in need of assistance. This certificate is offered in a blended delivery format with lectures and class work being done online, and all practicum placements and labs being in person. This program is offered in multiple communities, including Red Deer, Drumheller, Innisfail,

Ponoka, Rocky Mountain House, Stettler and Sundre.
