As we step into March, I am incredibly proud to share some remarkable achievements that highlight the academic excellence at Didsbury High School. Thanks to the hard work of our students, the dedication of our staff, and the support of our families, DHS continues to shine as a leader in education within our province.

Outstanding Academic Achievements:

We are thrilled to announce that DHS has achieved a 5-year high school completion rate of **91%**, demonstrating our commitment to ensuring every student has the support and resources needed to reach the finish line. This achievement reflects the perseverance of our students and the dedication of our staff to guide them along the way.

Our students' participation in the Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) is **10%** higher than the provincial average, showcasing their engagement and our community's emphasis on academic growth and assessment readiness.

When it comes to diploma exams, **84%** of our Grade 12 students are achieving the acceptable standard, which is well above the provincial average. Even more impressive, **96%** of students completing a diploma course passed that course (269/280- courses passed), demonstrating the strength of our instructional practices and the hard work of our students.

One of the most telling indicators of our academic environment is the number of students who are challenging themselves academically. 63% of our Grade 12 students wrote four or more diploma exams—higher than the provincial average year after year. Since only two exams are required for graduation, this statistic reflects our students' ambition to broaden their knowledge and keep as many post-secondary opportunities open as possible.




Library News


Hot Lunch is Back!



A huge congratulations to the curling team who took home bronze at Provincials! The finals were rough, but they played with integrity and perseverance and we could not be more proud of their accomplishment.




Some School Fun
